Toilets

Proposal to Close Toilets

Current Position:

- Cost of provision of the toilets is c£12,000 per annum.
- On average there are 250 uses per month, 3,000 per annum
- This equates to a cost of c£4 per use, the Parish Council receives 50p minus deductions
- Most uses are by non-residents
- Effectively Milnthorpe taxpayers are paying c£3.50 for every use of the facilities.
- The PC receives c£1,500 per year in entry fees
- Costs include cleaning, servicing, maintenance, emergencies, water, electricity, provisions (toilet rolls etc)
- There continues to be abuse of the facility with the door being propped open, the door handle being vandalised, damage to internal fittings, inappropriate use of the radar key etc.

Options considered:

- Increase precept to cover the cost (too late for 2025/26) by c£10,500, which is equivalent to c£15 per taxpayer. Is this good use of the precept when it is not being used for the benefit of the village as a whole?
- Check to see if there is a grant available
- Return the toilets to W&F, it is believed that there is a 6-month break clause
- Increase the entry cost to meet cover the full running costs. This is unlikely to work as increasing to the required level will see no use of the toilets.

Outcome of meeting with W&F Council

- They were understanding. They pointed out that many villages do not provide similar facilities and many villages have returned leased toilet blocks to W&F Council. This includes Cartmel, one in Windermere, one in Ambleside. Predominantly only those in tourist hots spots remain active
- It was agreed that Milnthorpe does not have enough appropriate retail premises to develop a 'Toilet Use Scheme'
- There are no grants available
- Surrendering the lease and returning the building to W&F Council would mean that the toilets would close, W&F would not keep them open.
- After an internal process has been completed W&F Council may offer the building to parties who lodge an expression of interest in taking on the building. The W&F Community Development Officer has offered to help any potential interested parties, this help is to include completing paperwork, sourcing funding etc

Conclusion/Questions

- A decision needs to be made re the future of the toilet provision
- The toilets are not sustainable.
- A proposal to close the toilets will be included in the July meeting agenda
